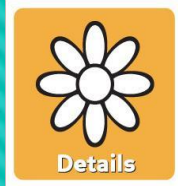
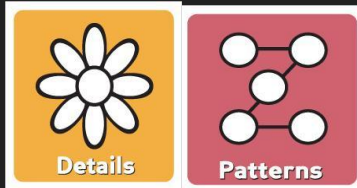

What are some patterns you have observed regarding critical thinking?

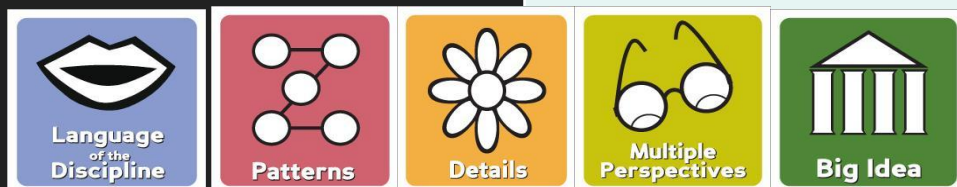


ICONIC INTERSECTION

Iconic Pathways: 4-3-2-1 Challenge

1. **FOUR** iconic prompts. (simple, 1 icon)
2. **THREE** iconic couples (2 icons on same topic)
3. **TWO** iconic intersections (2 icons within one prompt to further complicate the thinking)
4. **ONE** iconic pathway (utilizing intersections and other prompts to facilitate elevated critical thinking)

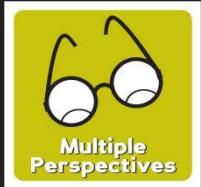

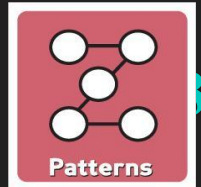

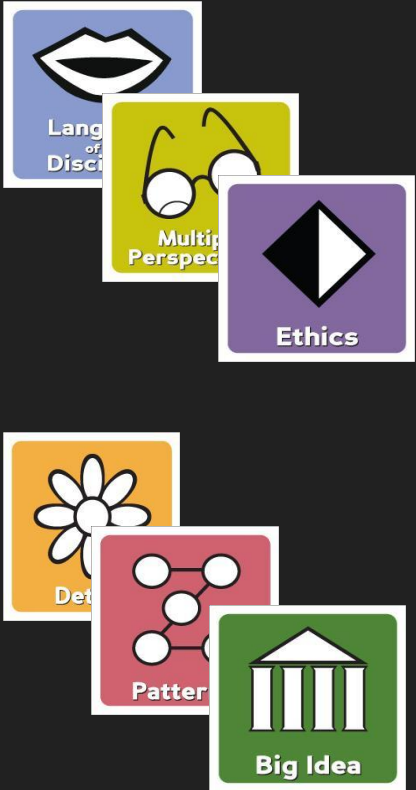
